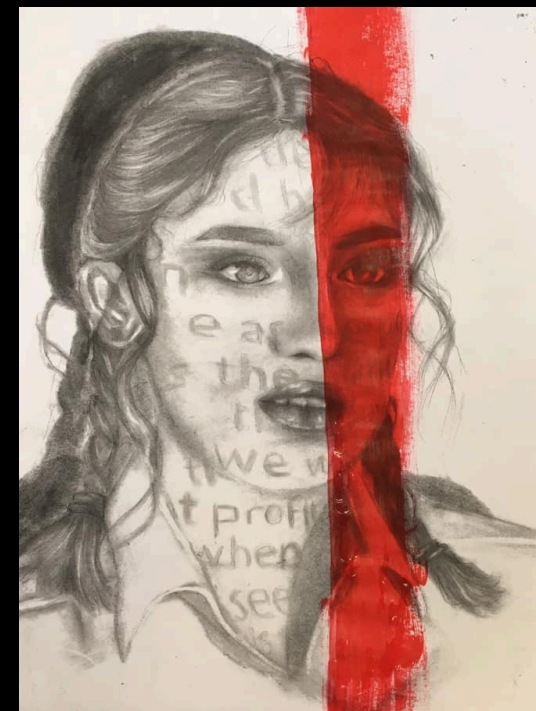
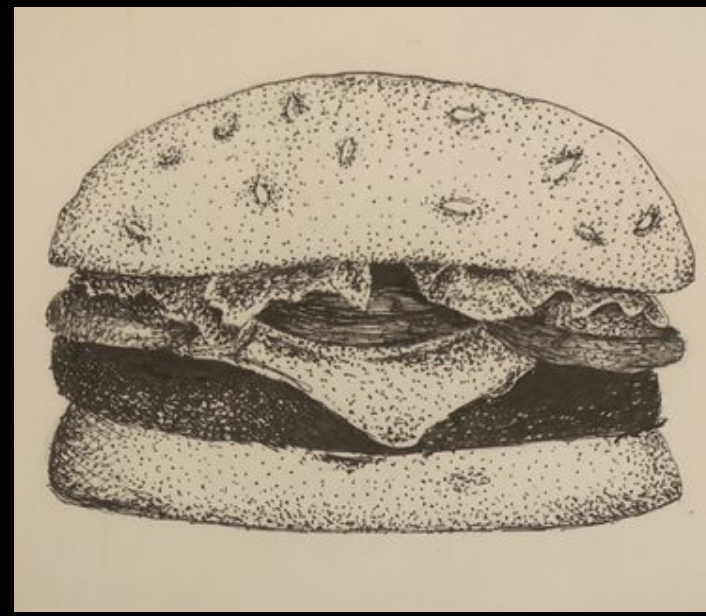

- ✓ You will get to personalise your projects so they are interesting to you

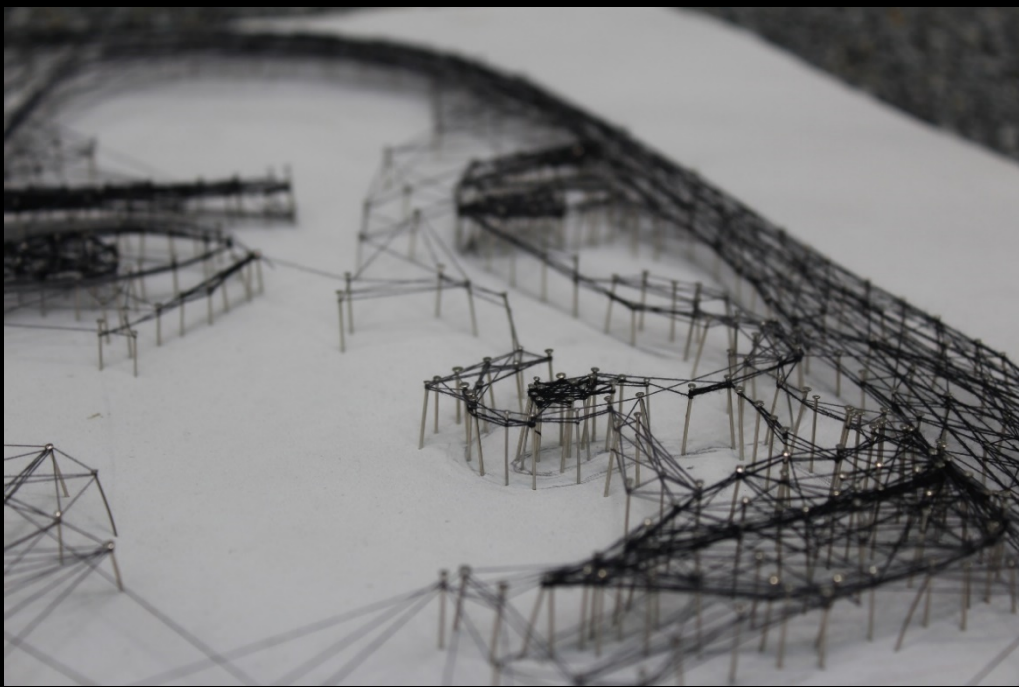
