



<b>Homework</b>	Have a timetable to ensure work is completed in a timely manner.	Check Teams. Support with a quiet work environment. Talk about the work. Email subject teachers if you are unsure about anything.
<b>Revision</b>	Over and above your homework you should be putting in about 10 hours of independent study in a week. Have a revision timetable.	Support with a quiet work environment. Talk about the work. Email subject teachers if you are unsure about anything.  Insist the revision has taken place. Have tech free time or tech as a reward.
<b>Minimising lates</b>	Value your lessons. Every minute does count.	Question your child on any late marks they receive, Students have ample time to get to a toilet and then to a lesson.
<b>Zero truancies and 100% attendance</b>	Value your lessons. Every minute does count.	Don't let your child dictate that a lesson/day is not that important. Private tuition can cost upwards of £25. For attendance focus on resilience – is your child genuinely too ill for school? Is that term-time holiday a must?
<b>Uniform and Jewellery</b>	Get it right. You know what you can and can't wear. That is why you look all the more beautiful outside of school!	Help your child to organise their clothes. Even if you're not a great believer in strict uniform codes support us so that our conversations can be all about the academia!
